


• With 14,473 fresh cases the positivity rate in Karnataka jumps to 10%, CM Bommai extends curbs, the total active cases in the state jumps to 73,260 in which Bengaluru alone has logged over 10,800 new cases and the active tally of the city is over 59,000 cases. The CM Bommai in a virtual meeting decided to extend the covid restrictions in the state till the end of January, the CMO stated that the rising number of cases are concerning, and during the virtual meeting the rising number of cases among school children was discussed, a decision has to be taken to authorize the Deputy Commissioners of respective districts to call on closing schools based on the rising number of cases. The BBMP Chief Commissioner Gaurav Gupta stated that due to the sudden surge in the number of cases the number of random tests has been increased from 30,000 to 50,000 a day, aggressive checks are being conducted to control the rise of cases.
















• JNU has a meeting to discuss the implementation of the Common University Entrance Test from the next academic session. Currently, JBU holds its own entrance examination which is conducted by the National Testing Agency. Teachers' Association of the JNU expressed displeasure with the decisions and demanded that such a huge change in policy that will be affecting the admissions process in the university must be discussed thoroughly in faculty meetings at the center level. JNU students' union has also criticized the move and stated that the vice-chancellor has yet again chosen the period of the pandemic to put an additional agenda to the academic council meeting for passing CUCET without any deliberation and discussion with student community.





